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1. PURPOSE AND METHODOLOGY

As a new effort, this report is second in an annual series to present multi-lens data analytics; and unpacking the annual performance of the Small Grants Programme.

Covering the reporting period, July 1, 2017 - June 30, 2018, the report includes performance data of both Global and Upgraded Countries. SGP development results are calculated based on reporting by 120 SGP Country Programmes in this year's annual monitoring survey. Attached annex hosts more details on the countries covered, and their associated typologies.

Data Analytics are presented for each of the results areas as:

- (i.) key annual highlights;
- (ii.) disaggregation by Regions;
- (iii.) disaggregation by Least Developed Countries (LDCs);
- (iv.) disaggregation by Small Island Development States (SIDS);
- (v.) disaggregation by Upgraded Country Programmes (UCPs);
- (vi.) and any additional analysis as relevant for a given results area.

Data analytics is also accompanied with graphs as and when possible.

A conservative methodological approach is used for results calculations. Only results of the 1005 GEF funded completed projects during the reporting year are counted towards the analysis. This methodological approach is consistent with SGP results generation in past years', and excludes any ongoing progress from projects under implementation, unless explicitly stated.

The report is an effort is to enable deeper dive into data, and support evidence-based enquiry and learning. It is also meant to serve as a reference document for all reporting year development data - to meet analytics needs of SGP Country Programmes, and Central Programme Management Team.

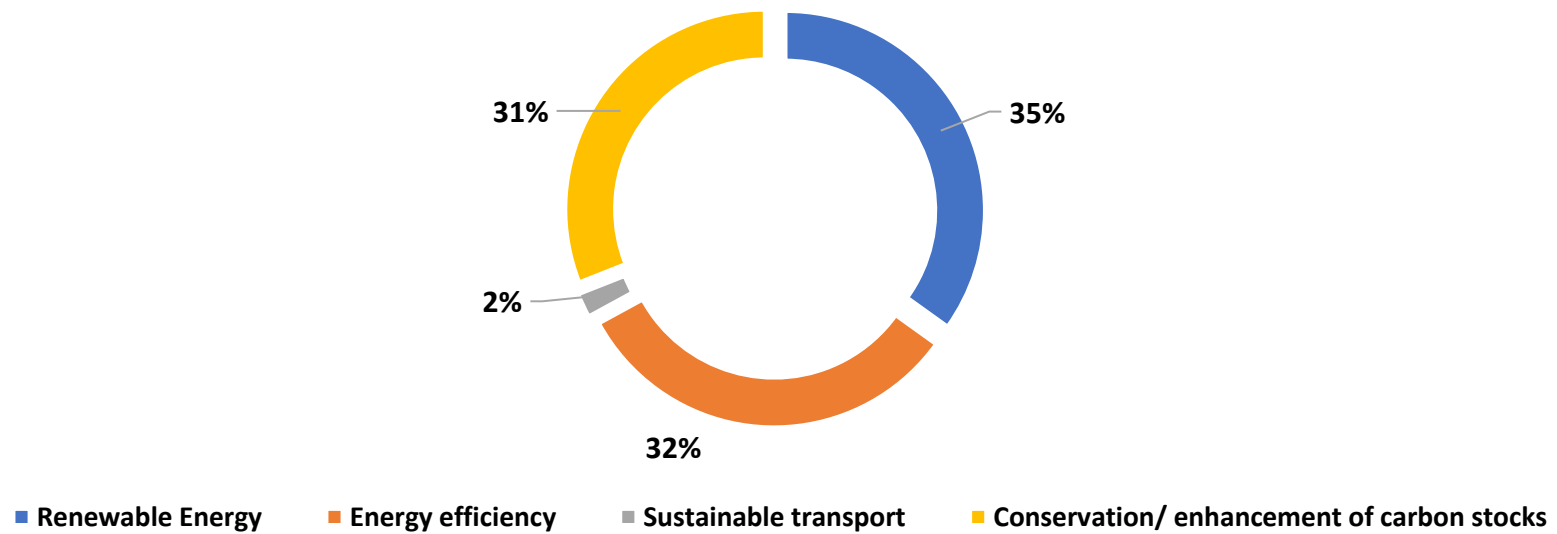

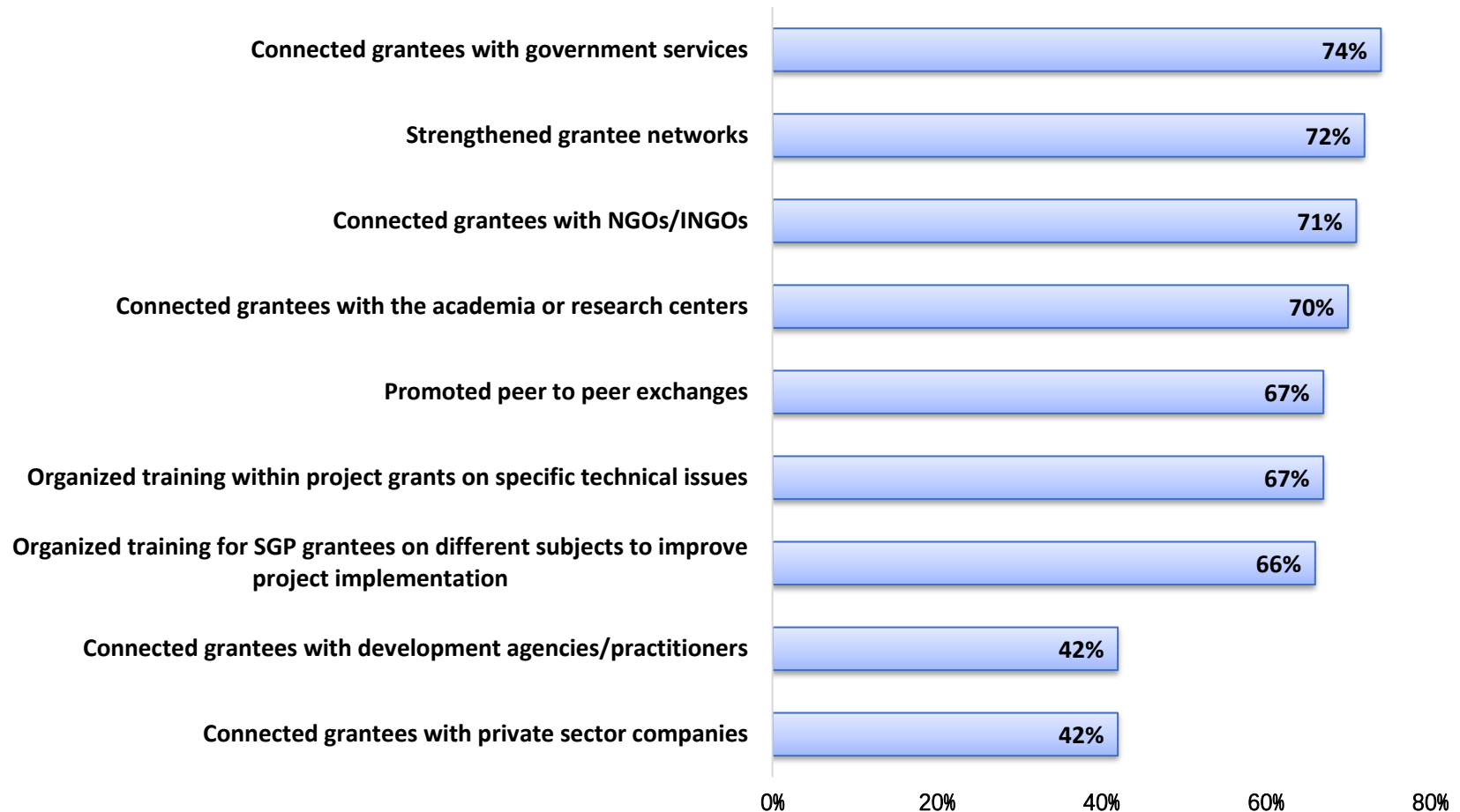

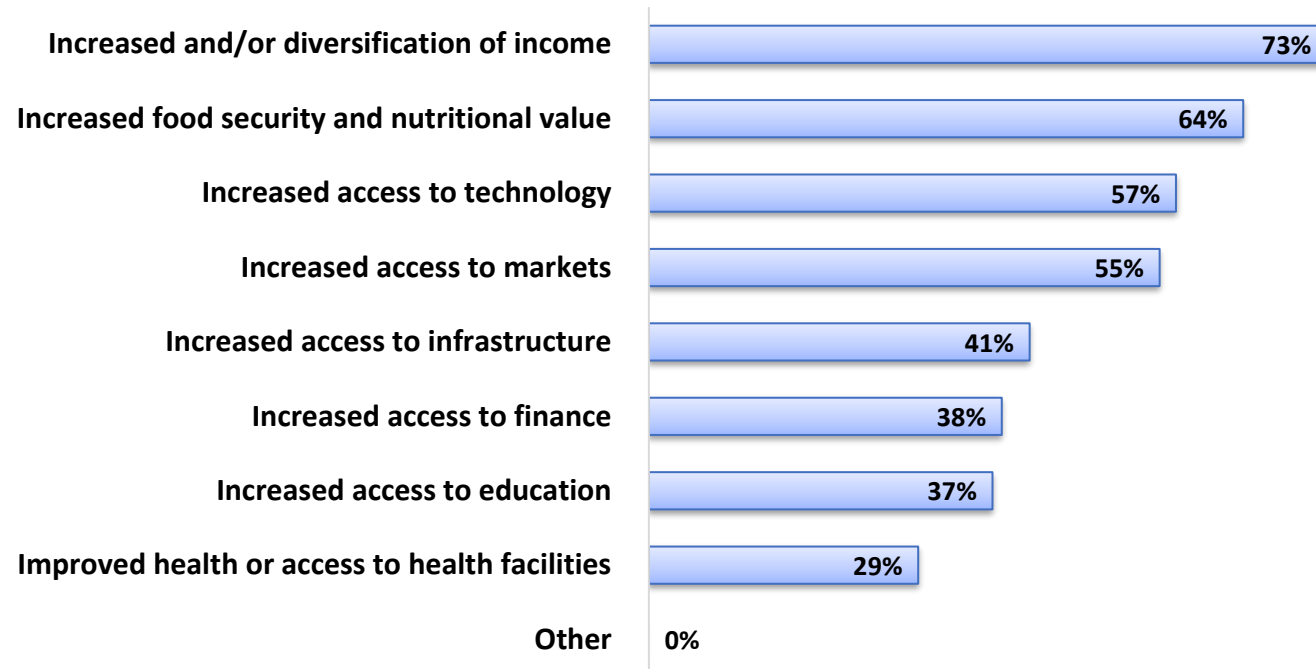

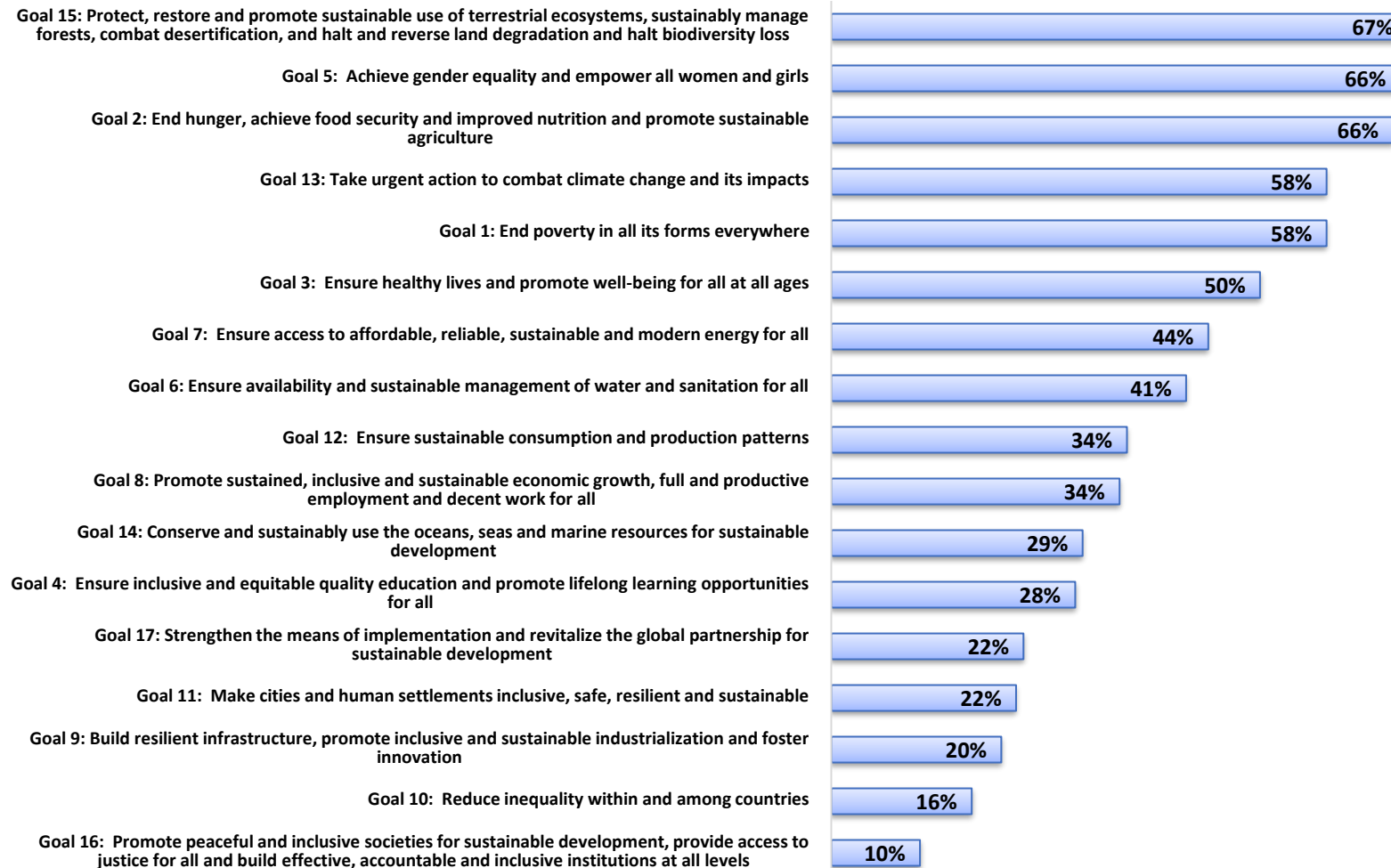

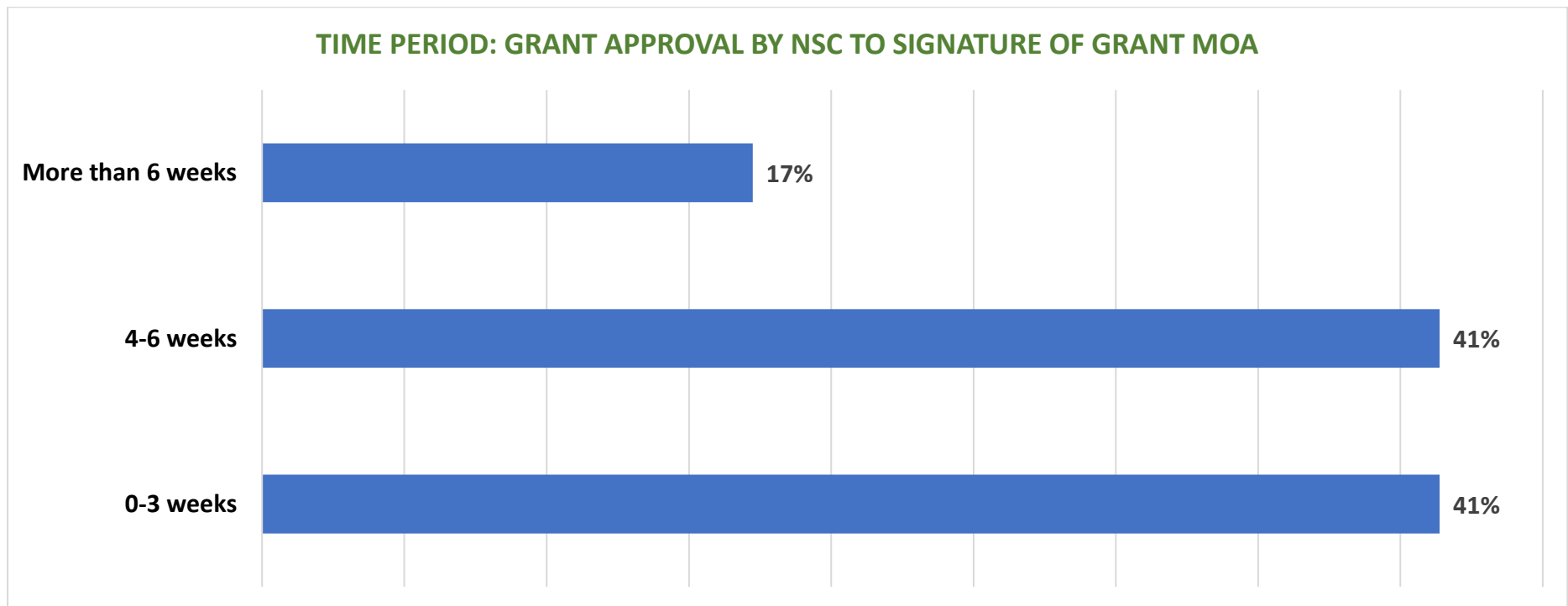

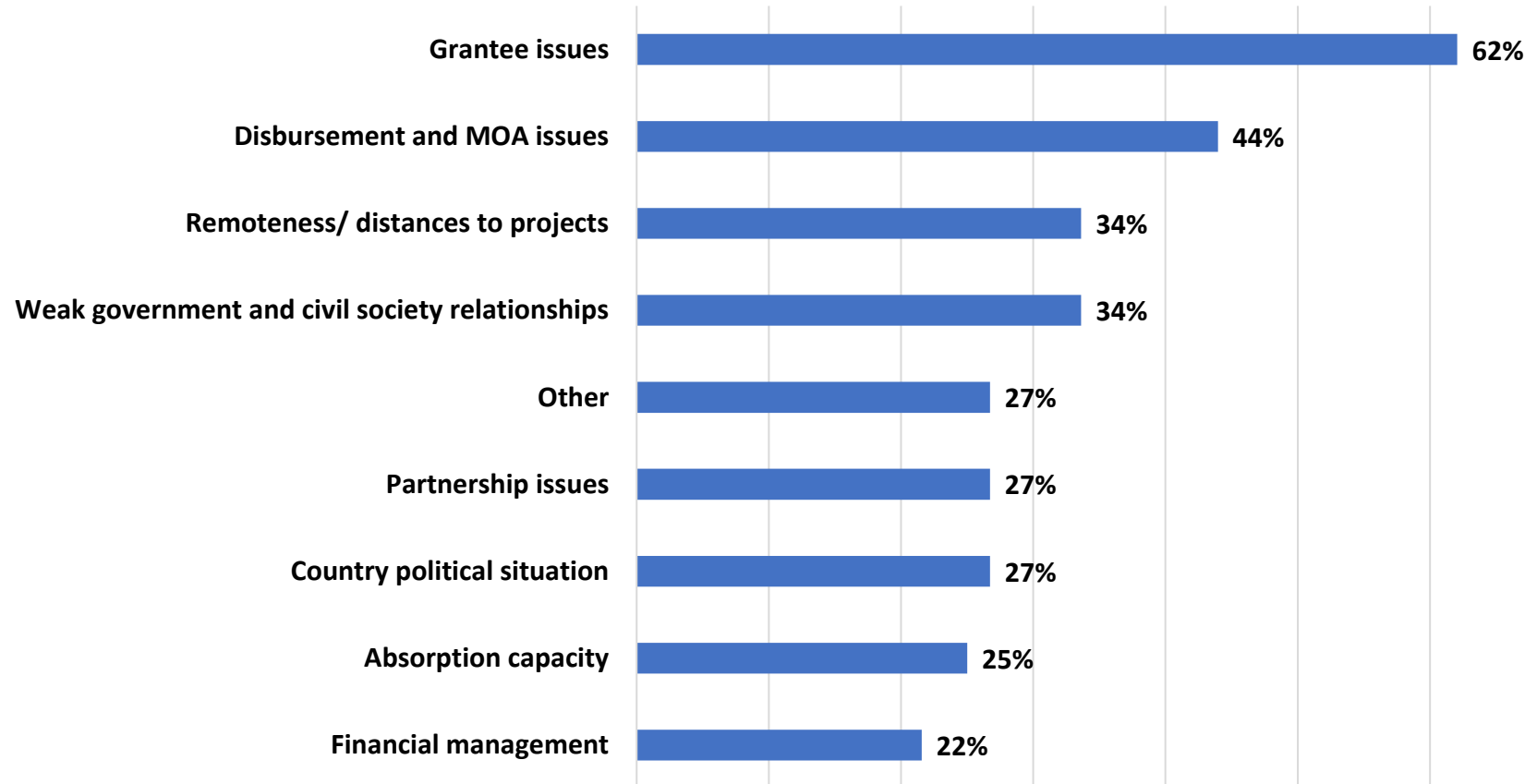

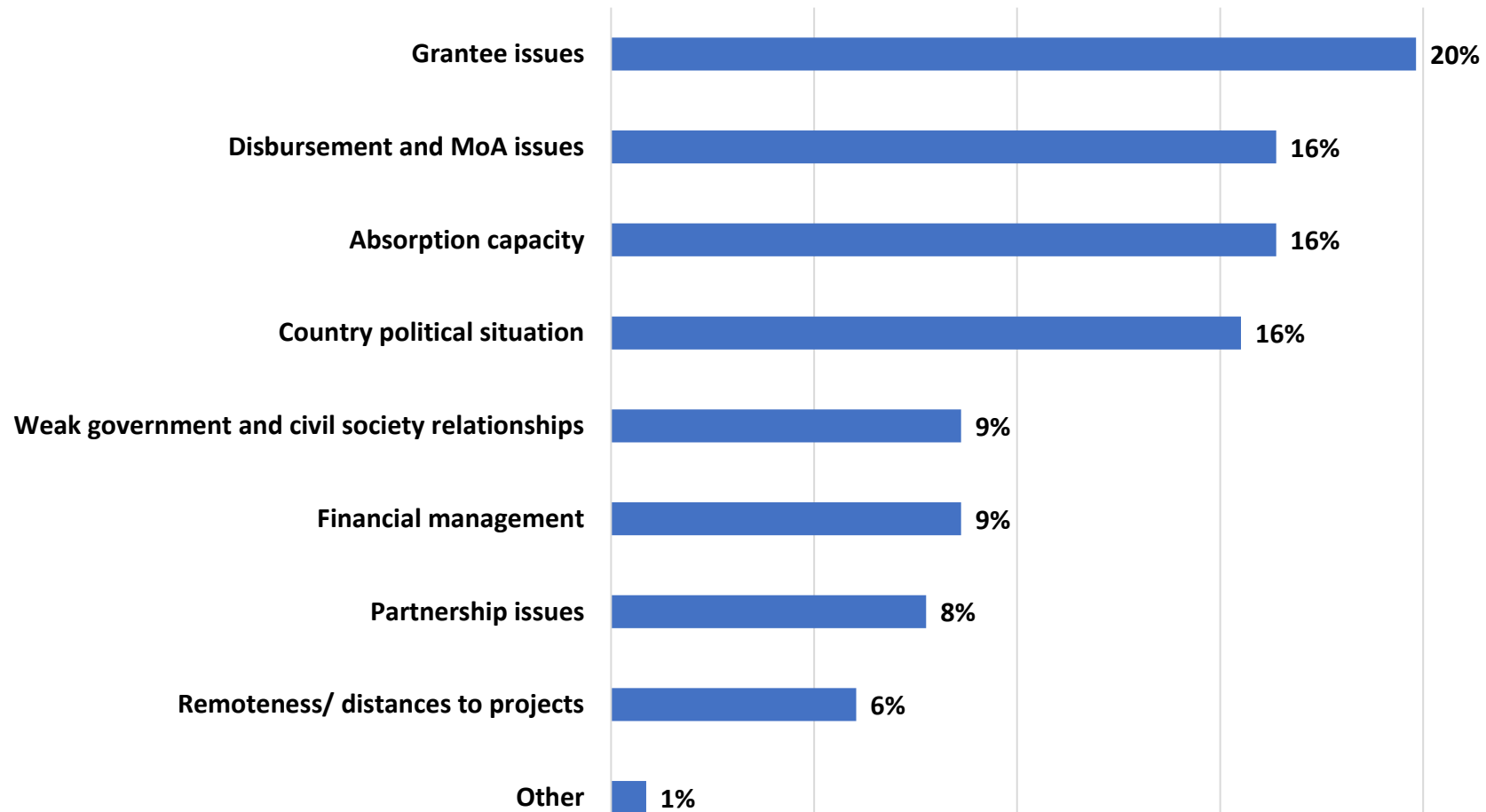
